## Jesus the Dying King

Appetizer: At a Colorado ranch, there was a girl who told some students how she came to Christ. She used to wear a cross on a chain, simply as a decoration. One day another student asked her, "Why do you wear a cross? Do you know what it means?" She was taken by surprise and stuttered that she just liked crosses. But the question stayed with her and haunted her until she joined a Bible study group where she learned about Jesus and the meaning of his cross.

Discussion: How is the cross sometimes used today by people who don't know what it means? What does the cross mean to you?

## Main Course: Read John 19:16-37.

- 1. What stands out to you in this passage?
- 2. In verses 17 and 18 John uses very few words to describe the physical act of crucifixion. Why do you think that is?
- 3. Notice the title that Pilate puts over Jesus' head on the cross (vv. 19-20). Why did he put it there if he didn't really believe it?
- 4. Jesus' concern for his mother is a tender, last human act (vv. 25-27). What insight does it also give us into her relationship between Jesus' earthly and spiritual families?
- 5. A) It has been said that Jesus' cry "It is finished" (v. 30) was a shout of triumph, not a cry of resignation. What had Jesus finished?B) What does that mean for you and me? (See John 1:29; 17:1-4).
  - Read John 19:38-42.
- 6. What does the story of the burial add to the significance of Jesus' death?
- 7. The cross becomes the dividing line between belief and unbelief. Who in this chapter is on the side of belief, and who is on the side unbelief? Explain.

- 8. The soldiers' gambling (v. 24) seems like a small detail. But here and in verses 28 and 36 John sees the crucifixion as fulfilling Old Testament Scripture. What significance does this give to Jesus' death?
- 9. Why are the incidents in verses 31-37 about not breaking Jesus' legs but piercing him with a spear important----- What do they prove?

**Dessert:** Nicodemus has appeared twice before in John's Gospel (see 3:1-12; 7:50-52) What effect does Jesus' death seem to have on him?
