Did You Know?

Jesus loved when the little children worshiped Him and so do we! We offer several ministries for you and your young ones during services that you can choose to take advantage of:

- **Attended Nursery** (up to 24 mo.)—Located down the children's hallway. You can drop off your child with an attendant or stay with him/her.
- **Un-Attended Nursery** (up to 24mo.) – Located at the center-back of the auditorium. You can sit with your child and listen to the service.
- **Nursing Room**— Located at the Northwest of the auditorium.
- **Training Room**— Located at the Southwest end of the auditorium.
- **Children's Bible Hour** – classes for ages 2/3 and 4yrs– 4th grade. Children can be dismissed after communion.

The Kingdom of God

Romans 14:17,18 ⁷ For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit, ¹⁸ because anyone who serves Christ in this way is pleasing to God and receives human approval.

Luke 17:21 ²⁰ Once, on being asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, Jesus replied, "The coming of the kingdom of God is not something that can be observed, ²¹ nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is in your midst."

The word "kingdom" is found fifty-five times in Matthew, twenty times in Mark, forty-six times in Luke, and five times in John. Jesus refers to the kingdom of God, the kingdom of Heaven, and His Kingdom about eighty times. This is why we can say this teaching was very important to Christ's ministry. It's often referred as the main theme of His teaching. One other thing that can be said for the Kingdom of God, is that it's a great mystery, and that can be seen in the number of vastly different commentaries found on the subject.

In the [Luke passage above](#), the context of Jesus' statement is a question put to Him by His Pharisee detractors who had asked when the kingdom of God would come. Jesus' answer was that the kingdom of God was not coming in the manner the Pharisees were expecting. The kingdom would not be inaugurated with spectacle or splendor. It would not be an earthly example of staking out a geographical claim and routing the Roman occupation. Instead, the kingdom would come silently and unseen, much as yeast would work through [a batch of dough](#). (see [Matthew 13:33](#)). Interestingly, Jesus said the kingdom had already begun right under the Pharisees' noses. God was ruling in the hearts of some people. The King Himself was standing among them, and the Pharisees were oblivious to this.

There are various translations of the Greek in verse 21. The phrase translated "within you" in the KJV and NKJV is translated as "in your midst" in the NIV, NASB, and NET, "among you" in the NLT and HCSB, and "in the midst of you" in the ESV. Earlier versions of the NIV had "within you" with a marginal note suggesting "among you." There is obviously a difference between saying "the kingdom of God is within you" and "the kingdom of God is among you." "Within you" is not seen as a favorable translation because Jesus was speaking to the Pharisees at the time. Jesus was surely not saying that the kingdom of God resided within the Pharisees' hearts. The Pharisees opposed Jesus and had no relationship with God. Jesus in other places denounced them as "whitewashed tombs" and "hypocrites" ([Matthew 23:27](#)).

This is why I would suggest the better translation would be "in your midst" or "among you." This approach has Jesus telling the Pharisees that He brought the kingdom of God to earth. Jesus' presence in their midst gave them a taste of the kingdom life and was confirmed through the miracles that Jesus performed. Jesus mentions on other occasions that His miracles were proof of the kingdom. Lk.11:20
In the end, there are three popular interpretations of Jesus' words in [Luke 17:21](#). The first is that the kingdom of God is essentially inward, within man's heart. The second is that the kingdom is within your reach if you make the right choices. The third is that the kingdom of God is in your midst in the person and presence of Jesus. In other words, Jesus was most certainly inaugurating the kingdom and changing the hearts of those who believed and desired His rule over their hearts.

There was no better example of the kingdom than Jesus Christ as he remained loyal to the Father all the way to the cross. This is why we often refer to the Kingdom as God's rule of one's heart. This is the only kingdom that matters for eternity. All other kingdoms are temporal. The Christian community will never come to a total and common understanding of the Kingdom until Christ returns. It will always be somewhat of a mystery, but it will also be a blessing as we choose to accept His rule and authority over our lives. If we want to be all that God wants of us, we must give him our hearts.
